## **Our Topic –Super Fantastical Beasts**

This term, our topic is all about 'fantastic' things, and has a scientific theme. We will explore, observe, categorise and investigate animals and look at the scientific discoveries of Mary Anning. Our topic will also explore the Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship curriculum (PSHCE), in which children learn about themselves, other people, responsibilities and relationships. We will be finding out about how to be a friendship hero, how to care for ourselves and the new reception children.

# **Reading at Home**

We will continue to encourage and celebrate regular reading with reading certificates awarded in celebration assemblies for the number of times the children have read. Please help us to monitor this by numbering each reading entry in your child's reading record, one number per day (rather than one each time they read). It is important that your child's reading books and Reading Diary are in their book bag every day as we like to take every opportunity to read with them!

### <u>Homework</u>

We will be learning to spell the Year 1 common exception words and practising these daily through a range of activities and as part of our phonics scheme. We will be sending home a copy of the Year 1 words, and a list of ideas to help you practise these with your child. We will continue to practise our fine motor skills in school daily using Letterjoin but you can also access this website from home if you feel it may benefit your child: https://www.letterjoin.co.uk.The username is ak3814 and the password is home.

This year your child will also have access to the TTRS website where they can play games to develop their times tables recall and fluency. This year we will focus on 10x, 2x and 5x tables. We will use TTRS in school as part of our Maths learning but you can also access this website from home if you feel it may benefit your child. Letters with individual usernames and passwords will be sent out following the Newsletter.

#### Half-Term Challenge: 10 Things to Do Before You're 7!

Each half-term we encourage your child to take part in an activity at home. Please help your child to record this by **taking photos or videos, drawing pictures, or writing** about their experiences. Any evidence on Tapestry Journal can be shared and celebrated in class.

This half-term's home challenge is to complete a new outdoor activity. This could be <u>anything</u> that your child has not done before but must be outside. Here are just a few suggestions:

- Roll down a grassy bank
- Paddle in a stream
- Learn to ride a bike
- Make perfume from flower petals
- Make a picture outside using natural resources (stones, leaves, etc.)
- Climb a tree
- Make a sandcastle













- Make a den in the garden
- Fly a kite
- Collect ten different leaves
