Our Topic : Around the World – Into Africa

This term, we will be travelling across the world, learning about our class country: Kenya, in Africa. We will find out about the geography, culture, and traditions of Kenya. We will immerse ourselves in Kenyaninspired music, stories, and art. We will discover the diverse culture of African, drawing comparisons by asking what would it be like to live in this part of the world. Much of our writing this half-term will be stimulated by photographs and stories about this amazing country. Reading at Home

Please continue to provide your support by reading daily at home. We also encourage and celebrate regular reading with reading certificates awarded in celebration assemblies for the number of times the children have read. Please help us to monitor this by numbering each reading entry in your child's reading record, <u>one number per day</u> (rather than one each time they read). It is important that your child's reading books and Reading Diary are in their book bag <u>every day</u> as we like to take every opportunity to read!

Each half-term we encourage your child to take part in an activity at home. Please help your child to record this by taking photos, drawing pictures, or writing about their experiences.
