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Dear Parent/Carers,

Our Topic - Let's Go Outside

After fantastic learning about creatures that live in rivers, seas and oceans, we are now looking closely at forest areas outside. We will look closely at different species that live in our woods and forests. We will be following ideas from the National Trust to get us all outside! We will be reading lots of non-fiction and fiction books to find out about animals and plants that live in woods and forests. We will be learning lots of new vocabulary about our topic, as well as reading lots of poems linked to the theme of being outside.

Home Learning

To support your child's learning please can you read and encourage your child to 'have a go' at some of the activities suggested on the topic web. Also please do read non-fiction and fiction books at home to immerse your child into this world of amazing new discoveries! **Please do give your child the opportunities to read a range of books to you as well, as this will inspire lots of talk, acting and ideas for their learning.** Thank you for all the super home learning that has been brought in to share. The children choose if they would like to take their learning home, or show it on display within the classroom. Each child has their own space to display their favourite pieces of work that they feel proud of, therefore making them feel that their achievements are validated.

Reading

Our recent phonics progress in our class has been amazing, so a huge thank you for all the amazing reading that is happening at home, it really does have a big impact on the pace of which children learn to read. Please do **encourage your child to read daily**. This involves encouraging your child to use the pictures to help them read unfamiliar words and understand the story too. We will continue to **change 4 books on a weekly basis**. Please continue to read a range of books to keep your child's interest in reading. **Please remember to record your comments in the Reading Diary daily**. Each comment needs to be about how your child has understood or discussed the story and their attempts to read key words or sentences. **Please do remember to bring in your child's bookbag everyday as your child will need their reading books.**

Red/Green Words (RW1)

Thank you for encouraging your child to read the green/red words on a daily basis. We continue to see an improvement in the children's progress who do read regularly so please keep on reading these daily. To read green words we use our phonic knowledge to sound out and blend. Red words we read by sight only. Please also encourage your child to use the words within the correct context, for example 'sad,' 'The girl felt sad.' Please can you come and see us if you have any questions, we are here to support you.





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Trips

Our trip to Littlehampton Library was a great success! The children listened to stories and explored the library.

The children got their new library cards and were able to choose a book each to take home. The children walked back to school using super road safety skills and were very pleased when they got back to school to have a rest!
